## Teacher Guidelines

### Stop #1: Jaguar

When you approach this exhibit from the back, there are only 2 small windows from which to view the jaguar. Please bring your group around to the front of the exhibit by the Lexan (clear plastic) to allow your students optimal vision of the jaguar(s). Direct them to either of the 2 signs posted to find the answers:

\*Who am I?  
**Jaguar**

\*How high can the male jump?  
**b) 20ft**

\*Where do I live?

### Stop #2: Bongo

**Stops #2 and #3** are in the SAME exhibit, so you will only stop once for both animals. All answers can be found on the signs for each animal in front of the exhibit.

\*Who am I?  
**Bongo**

\*What do I eat?  
**a) leaves**

### Stop #3: Yellow-backed Duiker

\*Who am I?  
**Yellow-backed Duiker**

\*Is this a vanishing animal?

### Stop #4: Ocelot

This animal will be hard to “spot” because it is nocturnal (active at night). Try looking high up in the rocks. There is a colorful sign located directly between the 2 side-by-side ocelot exhibits that shows pictures of the ocelot as well as the answer to the question.

\*How many are left in Texas?  
**c) 100**

### Stop #5: African Lion

There are many viewing points for this exhibit and depending on where the lionesses are will depend on whether or not your students will be best able to see them. The answer, as well as a lion paw print cast, is located on the boardwalk near the covered platform.
